This icon will take you directly to the Kindle Store in the future. Locate the "Share" button in the Safari Menu bar at the top of it. From the drop-down menu of icons, select the "Kindle Store" icon to add it to your iPad Home screen. Tap "Add." Now you should have a Kindle Store icon on your Home screen. The PC version can be downloaded at amazon.com/gp/sendtokindle/pc The Mac version can be downloaded at amazon.com/gp/sendtokindle/mac 3 Send compatible documents to your Kindle app. There are three ways you can transfer files once you've installed the software. The methods are the same for both PC and Mac. Right-click (Ctrl-click on Mac) on the file(s) and select "Send to Kindle". Choose your iPad from the list of devices. Open the Send to Kindle application and drag-and-drop files into it. Select your iPad from the list of devices. Print a document and select "Send to Kindle" as the printer. A new window will open, allowing you to select the device you want to send it to. If you go to Device, you will see the books that are downloaded onto your iPad. To download books, go to Cloud and tap on the books you want to download. They will immediately start to download. Question What is wrong if my iPad suddenly won't download Kindle books from Amazon? If this happens even after you restart your device, something might be wrong with your account. Perhaps you should contact customer service or change your password. Question Can I read the books I downloaded to my iPad on my Kindle? If they're on the Kindle app on your iPad, then yes, you should be able to read them on your Kindle. Question After reading the sample, how do I get the rest of the book? There should be an option to purchase the book through the app/website you used to download the sample. Otherwise, you can find the book on Amazon's website and purchase it there. Question How do I stop books from automatically downloading on my iPad's Kindle app? My hubby and I share our Amazon account and he does not want my books on his iPad Kindle app. You can use a separate email account for the iPad app. This will enable you to read books downloaded by you without reaching your husband's account.
